Our partner, the Environment Agency, sponsor a Flood and Coastal Engineering course at Brunel University. # River Ash sheet piling reaches completion

Sheet piling work is now complete at the River Ash dam and at the Albury Tributary dam. The sheet piles form a continuous barrier below the ground along the line of the dam, known as a 'cut-off wall', with the piles driven over 20 metres below ground level.



### Key activity on site:

- Painting of the steel bridge beams
- Construction of the concrete bridge deck, supporting piers and the wingwalls which will support the embankment behind the bridge
- We will also start building up the soil embankment either side of the bridge which will carry the new Albury Road over the bridge.





Temporary traffic lights will be used between 10am and 3pm, Monday to Friday, during the dates listed below.

In the vicinity of Tilekiln Farm, west of Little Hadham:

- Monday 17th February Friday 21st February
- Monday 2nd March Friday 6th March

A120 Hadham Road in the vicinity of Hadham Park, east of Little Hadham:

Monday 24th February – Friday 28th February

# The Ford: Full road closure from Saturday 15 February - Sunday 23 February

This closure will be used by British Telecom and other utility companies to complete diversion works.

The closure will be 24 hours per day for safety reasons. Work is currently planned between 7:00am and 7:00pm to minimise noise affecting nearby residents. Access will be maintained to The Smithy for residents, visitors and deliveries. Access is also still available for pedestrians via the footpath during these works.
